



An International Perspective

Regan O'Neill '11 is settled in to her freshman year at Kent State University, beginning her pursuit of a degree in architecture. However, not so many months ago, Regan was spending her senior high school year living with the Köster family in Hohewuth/Loxstedt, Germany, near the city of Bremerhaven, close to the North Sea. The family has three daughters who range in age from 3 to 9, and also hosted an Australian exchange student. That left little time for Regan to get homesick!

The German classroom setting was more like college than high school. According to Regan, "You would go to school for as long as you had classes, some days six hours, other days eight and, if the teacher wasn't there we didn't get a substitute, the class was just cancelled."

"In the U.S. we do a lot of homework, a lot of things to help you improve your grade. In Germany, we had three tests for the whole year and those tests are what count for your grade," she said. Also, the school year was much longer in Germany than in the United States.

She started classes Sept. 12, the day after she arrived in the country, and ended classes July 6, a week before she came home. Regan felt it was often easy to have involved conversations with those she met.

"Germans are a lot more open about some things. They don't really have conversations with people they don't know well but, when they do have conversations, they don't hold back on anything," she said. "They talk about what they want and share all of

their opinions."

Regan spent much of her time in Germany visiting various sites with her host family, visiting major cities such as Berlin, Cologne, and Hamburg. "It was good to have a change different from my family, and it really made me realize how much I appreciate my family." While Regan was not back in the States in time for graduation ceremonies at St. Wendelin, she was able to watch her classmates walk across the stage at graduation by way of Skype, along with her host family in Germany.

Upon her return, Regan says "I saw many things from a different perspective and began to wonder why Americans do things the way we do. Also, it was difficult to fit right back in with my friends since I had missed a whole year of events, entertainment and teenage interests. I missed my host family and felt like my world was once again flipped upside down. Now, I enjoy being home, but would definitely love to go back." Regan keeps in touch with her German family via Skype once or

While Regan was living in Germany during her senior year, the O'Neill family welcomed Reinert Saebo Eldoy, an exchange student from Stord, Norway, into their home, as part of the Youth for Understanding (YFU) The opportunity to experience the American way of life and a St. Wendelin education came to mean more to

Reinert than he had ever hoped for. June O'Neill, Reinert's host mom, states, "Reinert arrived with a great attitude of wanting to learn and make the most of his experience. St. Wendelin is very different from his school in size (several hundred in his class at home) and activities. In Norway, there are no extracurriculars with school, just activities with clubs or groups outside of school."

While at St. Wendelin, Reinert was active in band, drama, swim team and track. Other than band, these were activities he would never have participated in at home. He was an accomplished trumpet/cornet musician and shared his talents with the pep, jazz and concert bands, as well as a few times with the Contemporary Choir at Mass. He often said he liked St. Wendelin because of the family atmosphere. He truly enjoyed friends he made while at St. Wendelin and hopes to return to the United States someday.

Reinert's family came to Ohio in June for a few days, and the O'Neills spent a day in New York City with Reinert's family while picking up Regan.

Members of the **Bishop Robert Baker Council** and the **Rev. Ambrose Weber Society** gathered on October 22 to celebrate the success of the 2011 Annual Fund. Thanks to 10 members of the Bishop Baker Council and 33 members of the Weber Society, a strong base is now in place to attract new donors.

The Bishop Baker Council was established in 2009 to honor Fostoria native and former St. Wendelin student Bishop Robert Baker with annual contributions of \$5,000 or more to the Annual Fund. Bishop Baker and his siblings are all St. Wendelin alumni, and he was a member of the Class

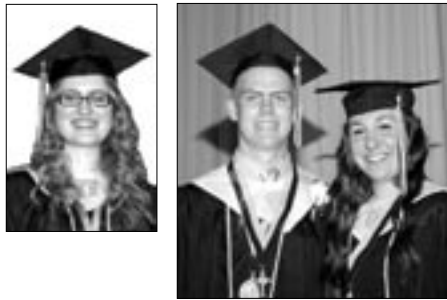

Aviation Project Celebrates Success

The building of the Challenger II airplane, under the supervision of science teacher, Mr. Ron Bowerman, is complete and the plane is ready

to take flight. The plane, christened the *ArchAngel*, is part of a partial re-enactment of the first flight across the US, with in-flight data collected for use in labs. The data will be available for teacher and student use.

More than 100 people attended an Open House on June 5, where the CEO of BRS Aerospace, Mr. Larry Williams, presented Mr. Bowerman and the students a ballistic parachute for the plane, and gave a presentation on aerospace engineering.

The Challenger II project began in 2008 with the construction being done by St. Wendelin students and other volunteers. Following extensive flight testing, the *ArchAngel* will be sent to
