Dear Folks,

In the December 08 issue of Knights Of Columbus magazine, Columbia, these are the statistics offered concerning attitude of Americans toward abortion.

92 % of Americans believe there should be restrictions on abortion.  
71 % of self-described “pro-choice” Americans agree that abortion should be significantly restricted, at least to the first three months of pregnancy.

Only 29% of non-practicing Catholics describe themselves as “pro-life”, while 65% of practicing Catholics identify themselves as such. 77% of Americans believe that parents have the right to know when someone under the age of 18 seeks to obtain an abortion. 84% of practicing Catholics do so.

We don’t have the percentages of early Church believers but a Roman writer stated that “these Christians don’t expose their infants to die.” Jesus said; “Let the children come to me for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven,” and “Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea.” The Code of Canon Law is very clear: ‘A person who procures a completed abortion incurs an automatic (latae sententiae) excommunication.’ More on this in the next bulletin.

Isn’t it time for us, especially if we believe in children and life, to become 100% committed?  
Where is the enemy that sows falsehood and makes evil look like good?

Let us continue in prayer. I will write more on the evil of abortion next week and the tremendous mercy of God who can touch the hardest and the weakest among us.

### Health Ministry News You Can Use: Safe Winter Walking

Walking to and from parking lots and between buildings during the winter requires special attention to avoid slipping and falling. No matter how well the snow and ice is removed from streets and sidewalks, you will encounter some slippery surfaces when walking outdoors in the winter. It is important to be continually aware of the dangers and to walk safely on ice and slippery surfaces. Here are some tips:

- Plan ahead; give yourself sufficient time and plan your route.
- Wear shoes or boots that provide traction on snow and ice: rubber and neoprene composite. Avoid plastic and leather soles.
- Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles; use the vehicle for support. Remember that the garages are NOT ice-free. Garage floors are the first to freeze because the temperature changes cause icing of the garage surfaces.
- Walk in designated walkways as much as possible. Taking shortcuts over snow piles and areas where snow and ice removal is not feasible can be hazardous. Look ahead when you walk; a sidewalk completely covered with ice may require travel along its grassy edge for traction.
- When entering buildings, remove snow and water from footwear to prevent creating wet slippery conditions indoors.
- When given no choice but to walk on ice, consider the following:
  - Take short steps or shuffle for stability. Bend slightly; walk flat-footed with your center of gravity directly over the feet as much as possible. Be prepared to fall. If you fall, avoid using your arms to protect against breakage. Bend your back and head forward so you won't slam your head on the pavement as your feet shoot out from under you.

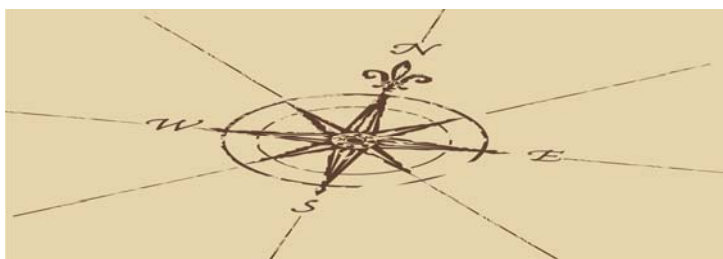
