

## HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS

### **Health Ministry News: Block the Sun, not the Fun!**

It's a fact: overexposure to the sun can result in skin cancer later in life. The vast majority, perhaps as much as 80% of a person's lifetime sun exposure, is estimated to occur by age 18. On average, children get 3 times more exposure than adults. Did you know that:

- You can sunburn even on a cloudy day.
- Concrete, sand, water, and snow reflect 85% to 90% of the sun's UV rays.
- Depletion of the earth's ozone layer continues to increase your exposure to UV rays.
- In some parts of the world, melanoma (the deadliest form of skin cancer) is increasing at rates faster than any other cancer. It kills one person every hour!

One blistering sunburn can **double** a child's lifetime risk of developing skin cancer.

Enjoy the outdoors and protect your family and yourself by following these simple sun safety tips:

- Apply sunscreen that protects against both UVA and UVB rays whenever you are outdoors year-round, i.e. picnics, walks, hiking, riding in the car, swimming, etc.
- Adults should use sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher. Children should use SPF 30 or higher. Apply liberally and make sure all skin is covered, including neck, ears, and scalp for people with thin hair. Thoroughly rub sunscreen over skin to make sure coverage is even.
- Apply sunscreen every two hours and after swimming, perspiring or toweling off.
- Wear UV protective sunglasses.
- Wear a hat with a wide brim.
- Seek shade at peak sun hours.

A special thank you to all those who took part in Operation Rice Bowl. The total sent to the Diocese for the Rice Bowl Collection was \$1,450.64.

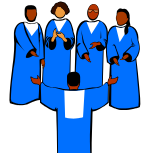


### **ITEMS LEFT IN THE PARISH LIFE CENTER**

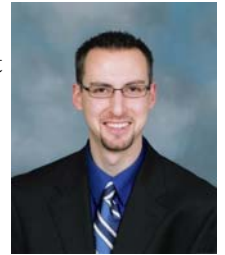
## MEMORIAL CHOIR

### “Get To Know Your Saints” Corner

June 1<sup>st</sup> - the Memorial of St. Justin, martyr (c. 100-165)

Justin was born in Palestine around the beginning of the second century. He became a professor of philosophy and was particularly attracted to the school of Plato. However, he found that the Christian religion answered the great questions about life and existence better than the philosophers. Upon his conversion, he continued to wear the philosopher's mantle, and became the first Christian philosopher. Justin is known as an apologist, one who defends in writing the Christian religion against the attacks and misunderstandings of the pagans (people who are not Christians, Jews or Muslims). Because of his defense of the Christian religion, Justin was beheaded in Rome in the year 165.

A patron of philosophers, Justin may inspire us to use our natural powers (especially to know and understand) in the service of Christ and to build up the Christian life within us. Since we are prone to error, especially in reference to the deep questions concerning life and existence, we should also be willing to correct and check our natural thinking in light of religious truth. Then we will be able to say with the saints of the Church: I believe in order to understand, and I understand in order to believe.
