In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit!

We celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity with the sign of our faith. It is a wonderful summary of what we believe. We believe that the Father loved the Son with the love of the Holy Spirit and that love brought Jesus into our midst. His love (the Trinitarian love) flowed out to us, even to death, death on the cross. It is this gift of faith that is proclaimed when we make that sign of the cross.

We baptize our children with the sign of the cross in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Those who are confirmed are marked with the sign of the cross; those who are sick are anointed with the sign of the cross; forgiveness of sins is offered with that same sign. The couple who are married are blessed with the sign of the cross. We receive Jesus Himself, Body and Blood as the sign of our faith and we begin each liturgy with that same glorious sign. It is a 'sign of folly to the Greeks and a scandal to the Jews' as St. Paul says. But to us, it is the sign of our salvation.

Whenever we make that sign of the cross in public, we profess our Catholic faith. People know us by that sign. I can remember times when I was held back from making that sign. A priest friend of mine always makes a sign of blessing over the food, no matter where he is or what company he keeps. One of my resolutions is never let fear, being ashamed, feeling awkward keep me from signing myself. May it be your resolution as well? It is also important that when we wear that crucifix around our neck, whether it is gold, silver or the rosary, we need to reflect to whom we are witnessing. A person who wears the cross with reverence brings faith to people. A person who wears it and scandalizes others by his/her behavior is a witness to evil and hypocrisy in the world.

A good action this week is to become aware of our use of this sacred sign: the sign of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

May you feel that blessing more powerfully this week!

Health Ministry News: June is Home Safety Month

According to the Home Safety Council falls are by far the leading cause of unintentional home injury death. Falls account for an average of 5.1 million injuries and nearly 6000 deaths each year. Walk through your home to identify and remedy potential falling hazards. Here are some tips:

- Have handrails on both sides of stairs and steps. Make sure handrails go from the top to the bottom of stairs.
- Have lots of lights at the top and bottom of stairs.
- It is best to remove small rugs. Tape to floor if you do use them.
- Keep stairways clear.
- Have night lights in bedrooms, halls and bathrooms.
- Use safety gates at top and bottom of stairs for babies and small children.
- Put bright lights over all porches and walkways.
- Wipe up spills immediately.
- Fix broken or chipped outside steps and walkways as soon as possible.
- Place handrails next to bathtub and shower.

Colin Campbell, the son of Dow and Susan Campbell, is a member of St. Michael Parish (Findlay) and was a finalist in the Fireside Catholic Scholarship Program, the only recipient in the Toledo Diocese. He served as Student Council President, a member of National Honor Society, and participated in cross country, golf, track and choir. Colin was also active in the Men's Discernment Group, band and the drama program.

Lindsey Marugg, daughter of Donald and Jill Marugg, is a member of Our Lady of Consolation Parish and valedictorian. She was a semi-finalist for the Toyota Scholarship, senior class president and a member of National Honor Society. Lindsey was in the Woman's Discernment Group, cheerleader, a band and choir member, and participated in track, basketball and drama club.

"GET TO KNOW YOUR SAINTS" CORNER

June 11 – The Memorial Feast Day of Barnabas, Apostle

Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to being a full-fledged apostle. He was closely associated with St. Paul and served as kind of a mediator between the former persecutor and the still suspicious Jewish Christians.

When a Christian community developed at Antioch, Barnabas was sent as the official representative of the Church of Jerusalem to incorporate them into the fold. He and Paul instructed in Antioch for a year, after which they took relief contributions to Jerusalem. Later, Paul and Barnabas were sent all over to preach to the Gentiles with enormous success.

Barnabas is spoken of simply as one who dedicated his life to the Lord. He was a man "filled with the Holy Spirit and faith, thereby large numbers were added to the Lord." He was known as one of the generous members of the idyllic and extremely poor Church in Jerusalem who shared everything he had to the community.
