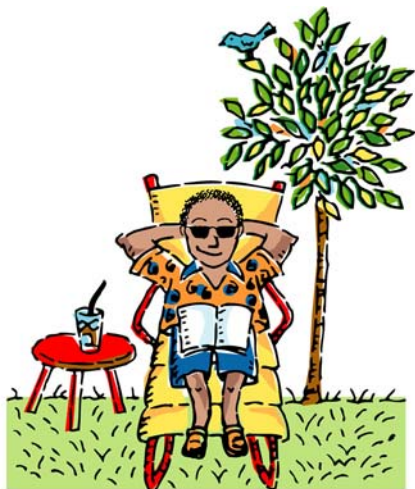
DEACON PRAYER CHAIN

Crown Financial Ministries' Life Group Leader Training

On August 15th St. Wendelin Parish will be hosting the first **Crown Life Group Leaders' Training** in our area. At this training not only will you learn financial strategies, but how to lead the Crown Life Group financial bible study. The Crown Ministries Biblical Financial Study "Life Group" is an amazing 10 week bible study which focuses specifically on Money Management and God's word. In this ten week course learn how to develop a budget, set up spending guidelines, learn strategies for paying down debt, set up a savings plan and more.

This is what Jeff & Mary Harmison said about their **Life Group** experience; *"The Crown Life Group Study has helped bring my husband and me into unity in the area of our finances. Before Crown, we didn't have a budget, we didn't have a long-range plan and we often disagreed over spending decisions. We never made horrible financial decisions before Crown, but now we have a set of clearly defined goals. Having those goals in place plus the confidence we have in knowing from the Word of God what we should and shouldn't be doing makes it so much easier to make agreed-upon financial choices. This has strengthened our marriage and our home."*

Now, you don't have to be a financial wiz or have all the answers to be a leader. Your role as a **Life Group** leader is not to teach (the teaching is done via DVD) but to facilitate discussion and provide a meeting point.

SWHS SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

St. Wendelin 8th graders, along with their families and friends, gathered at the school year's conclusion to recognize the accomplishments of students, and pray for continued blessings and success as they begin their high school education.

Dimitri Davidson and Samantha Birkmire received the **William F. and Corrine Reineke, Sr. Scholarship**. The award is \$250 for 2 years. Selection criteria includes a strong desire for Catholic education and to succeed academically, and involvement in school and/or parish activities. Applicants were asked to submit an essay explaining how a St. Wendelin Catholic High School education would benefit him or her.

Adrienne Emerine received the **Frank and Mary Bugner Scholarship**. The \$200 renewable was established for a St. Wendelin eighth grader who will continue his or her education at St. Wendelin Catholic High School. Criteria includes a strong desire to continue a Catholic education at the secondary level; a strong commitment to academic achievement; good moral and Christian character; involvement in school, parish and/or community activities, and a willingness to serve God and others. Applicants had to submit an essay titled, "Why is a Catholic education at St. Wendelin High School important to me?"

Also, receiving the **Rev. Donald S. Hunter Memorial Scholarship** were Kieran Campbell and Rodney Park of Findlay St. Michael, and Catrina Lang and Madaline Hoffman of Fostoria St. Wendelin School. The award (\$250) was established in the memory of Fr. Donald Hunter, a priest of the Diocese of Toledo and principal at St. Wendelin Catholic High School from 1954-1967. Criteria for this scholarship states: two students from Findlay St. Michael School and Fostoria St. Wendelin School with the highest grade point averages; a desire to continue a Catholic education at the secondary level; commitment to study and academic achievement, and good moral character.

Catrina Lang was awarded the **Sisters of Notre Dame Education Award** by Sister Elayne Bockey and Sister Teresita Richards.

"Get To Know Your Saints" Corner

June 24 – The Birth of John the Baptist

Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: "I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John..." But John would have agreed completely with what Jesus added: "Yet the least in the kingdom of God is greater than he" (Luke 7:28).

John spent his time in the desert as an ascetic, a person who leads a simple life, and denies himself material satisfaction. He began to announce the coming of the Kingdom, and to call everyone to reform their lives. His purpose was to prepare the way for Jesus. His baptism, he said, was for repentance. But One would come who would baptize with the Holy Spirit and Fire. John proclaimed that he was not worthy even to carry His sandals. His attitude toward Jesus was: "He must increase; I must decrease" (John 3:30).

John challenges us Christians to the fundamental attitude of Christianity—total dependence on the Father, in Christ. Except for the Mother of God, no one had a higher function in the unfolding of salvation.
