A number of folks have inquired about any precautions we are taking to limit the number of cases and to protect our folks. The schools are following a rigorous program of disinfecting surfaces. We have general directives but no specific ones from the diocese. They leave it up to our discretion. We will do the following:

1. In back of church, we have hand sanitizers. We have encouraged our greeters to take advantage of those. We also ask the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to use them before they help to distribute communion. You may have noticed that priests always wash their hands after the Offertory. This has been the custom since the gifts brought to the altar were produce and other eatable items.

2. For the Our Father! If you do not want to hold hands (by the way, holding hands is a local custom, not prescribed), just fold your hands, or pray with an open, palm up prayer gesture, as the priest does. This is a sign to the person next to you not to reach out to you. They will respect your gesture.

3. For Communion, if you are running a fever, or a cold, it is only prudent not to receive from the cup. There are people who only receive from the cup because of wheat allergies. Therefore, we do not want to discontinue the use of the cup at mass.

4. It is a precaution to protect your mouth while sneezing.

I hope this helps to clarify some of the issues folks have expressed to me.

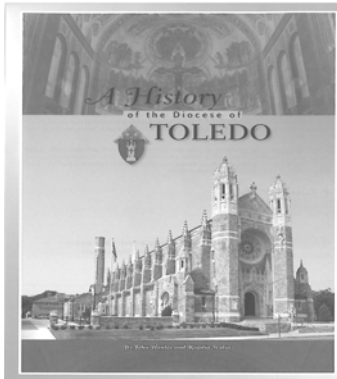
Fellowship Hosts
