### TWO GO TO STATE FOR TRACK

► Three St. Wendelin senior athletes placed at the Regional track meet in Tiffin, with **Jaunna Gase** and **Dillon Rickard** going on to the State Championships!

**Jaunna** ran the quickest time in the preliminaries of the high hurdles at 15.47, then ran a 15.41 in the finals to place 3rd and earn her third trip to Columbus in the event. In the low hurdles, she ran a 47.97 in the preliminaries and then a 47.58 to place 6th in the finals. Jaunna rounded out her scoring with a long jump of 16' 3" to place 8th in the long jump.

**Dillon** threw the shot put 51' 2-1/2" to place 4th and earned a trip to Columbus. **Mark Berton** placed 6th in the 3200M, running in the heat just three seconds off his career best time.

*Congratulations to all our fine athletes!* At state, Jaunna is running the 100 high hurdles and Dillon is throwing the shot put.

### ST. WENDELIN SCHOOL MOVING FORWARD WITH FAITH AND POSSIBILITIES

#### Weekly Update:

There will be no changes to the dress code for grades K-6 and grades 7-12.

Locker space will be available for students in grades K-6; they will not have to deal with combination locks. Students in grades 7-9 will use lockers on the third floor. Students in grades 10-12 will use lockers on the first floor.

The Art, Science, Music, Foods and Computer rooms will remain intact.

Physical Education is now a K-12 program, with

Bill Hrabak in charge of grades 7-12, and Cathy McAllister teaching students K-6. In addition, Bill and Cathy will share Athletic Director responsibilities. Donene Smith will coordinate the Athletic Department.

### Baptismal Policy of St. Wendelin Parish

Parents wishing to have their child baptized at St. Wendelin Catholic Church should contact the Parish Office at 419-435-6692 soon after you become pregnant. This is advised so you may finish the baptismal preparation before your child is born because of the many new demands added to a couple's life after the birth of a child.

#### 1. Make initial contact with the Parish Office

The Parish Office will send you the necessary information to proceed with the Baptismal Preparation Program, or you may pick it up at the office.

#### 2. Participate in the first session

This session will be given by Shellie Gabel, a priest, or deacon, one on one with the couple. We will talk about the history and meaning behind the sacrament of Baptism.

#### 3. Participate in the second session

At the end of the first session, you will need to register for the second session. These sessions are held 4 times a year. Our next "2<sup>nd</sup> session" will be held on **Sunday, June 13<sup>th</sup>**. Each session will begin with the 9:00 a.m. mass and conclude around 12:00 noon.

#### 4. Schedule your child's baptism

Baptisms here at St. Wendelin are celebrated on the third Saturday/Sunday of every month during any of the Masses. An alternate baptismal ceremony will be offered at 12:30 p.m. each third weekend of the month also.

Baptism is an initiation into a community. As a community, we rely on each other for help and support. As parents who promise during the Rite of Baptism to raise their child in the Catholic faith, it is expected that you participate in our parish community, especially in attending mass each weekend. Regular weekend Mass attendance is EXPECTED by parents, both before and after their child's baptism.
